

Front of Bill:

- **Your Account Information:** Your account number, account name and billing date are listed here.
- **Contact Information:** Ways to contact us about your bill or account are clearly noted on your bill. You can always reach us at 715-239-6800 or cvec@cve.coop.
- **Total Amount Due:** This section summarizes total amount due and due date. Automatic payment would be indicated if you participate in this program.
- **Monthly Energy Use Graph:** This graph shows electric usage as well as temperatures over the last year.
- **E. Billing Period Averages:** This section provides you with information regarding your daily average usage, daily average cost and average daily temperature for the billing period month. Distributed Generation (Solar/Wind) Accounts will display a section summarizing Net Meter Activity here instead of Billing Period Averages.
- **Message Center:** Important member information will be shared here.

G. Payment Stub: If you are paying by check, please return this stub with your payment to ensure the payment is properly credited to your account.




Back of Bill:

- A. Electric Service Description: The table at the top of the section shows your meter number, meter readings, service dates, and other information.
- **B. Account Information:** Your account number and detailed information about your account are listed here.
- **C. Energy Usage Comparison:** This comparison provides current energy usage, the previous month's usage and the previous year's usage. Distributed Generation (Solar/Wind) Accounts will display a section summarizing their usage on each meter.
- **Billing Summary:** Here you will find your past payments, current charges, and total charges due.
- **Message Center:** Learn more about programs, services, notices and events.
- **Ways to Pay Your Bill:** This area lists various ways you can pay your bill.
